



Be clear on the purpose first— then design the consortium to achieve that purpose.



- Design the consortium that will get results for all partners.
- A consortium can't be all things to all people.
- Consortia should create new value.

Organizing is what you do before you do something, so that when you do it, it is not all mixed up.

The process matters— take the time up front to develop common understandings and explicitly stated values.



- Include key players at the start.
- Sense of Urgency, feeling that this is important, the right thing to do.
- Barriers may be opportunities.

You can't stay in your corner of the Forest waiting for others to come to you. You have to go to them sometimes.

It's all about students— they may be "out of sight," but they can't be "out of mind."



- Online students need exceptional student services.
- Simplify administrative processes.
- Celebrate student success—have a party!

Consortia are relationships they need care and nurturing.




