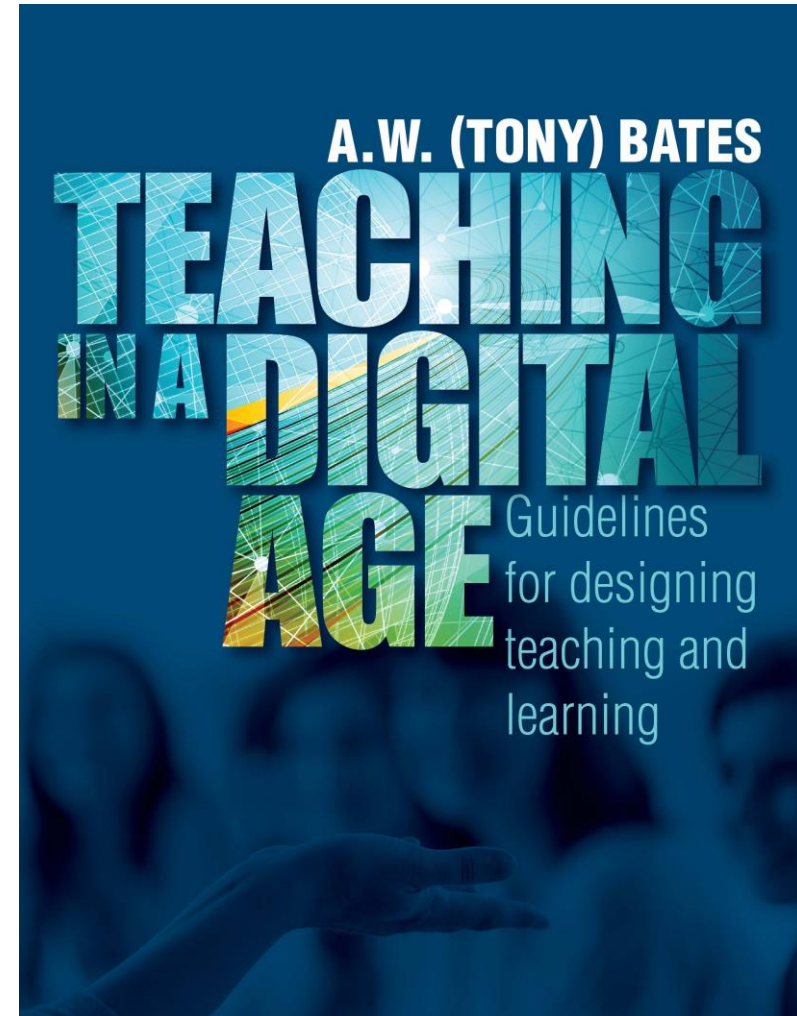

Not all courses can be easily moved online. What are some effective examples or alternatives?



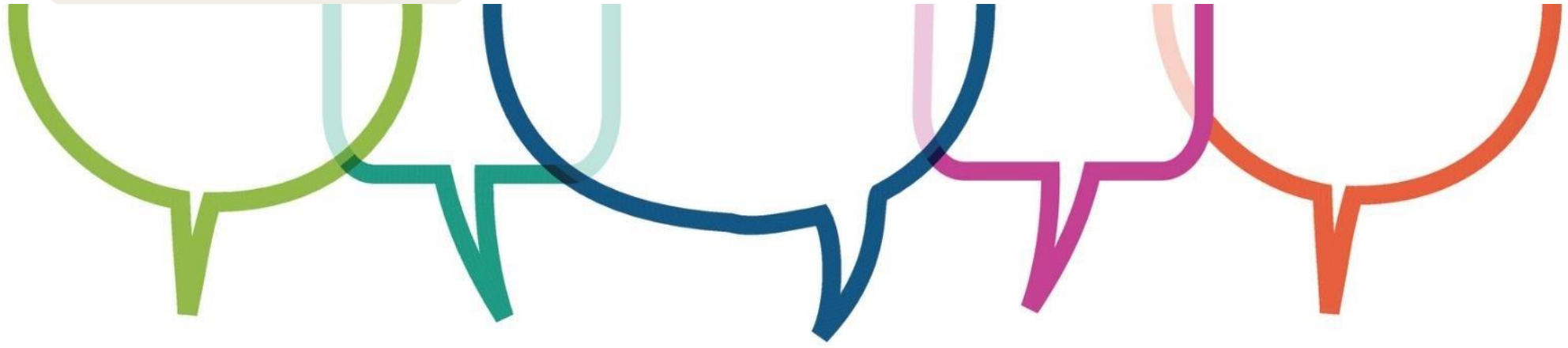
